# The Second Coming—How not to be deceived.



Read the following Bible story: 2 Thessalonians 2:1-4 (The Day of the Lord has not yet come)

The story's lesson for us today: Paul warns us to not be troubled or deceived by any means when it comes to the return of Jesus. The

Bible is our best defense and safeguard against falsehoods and deceptions.

What Jesus said: "Tell us, when shall these things be? and what shall be the sign of thy coming, and of the end of the world? And Jesus answered and said unto them, 'Take heed that no man deceive you." Matthew 24:3-4

(Isaiah 24:1; Jeremiah 4:23-26; Revelation 6:12-14)

8) What will happen to those caught up in the air with Jesus? (John 14:2-3; Revelation 20:6)

#### **Study Commentary:**

A predominant theme throughout the New Testament is Jesus' second coming, which is mentioned over 300 times, as well as alluded to in the Old Testament writings.

The specific time of Jesus' second coming is not mentioned in the Bible, but in warning, Jesus did mention to his disciples the signs of things that must come beforehand (see Matthew 24). Therefore, let us avoid the human tendency of wanting to predict the time of Jesus' return, which has led many in the past into confusion and disappointment.

As for Jesus' return, it will be a literal, visible, audible and worldwide event, which no one will be able to deny or avoid. Even the devil himself, who may impersonate Jesus in the last days, will not be able to fully counterfeit this grand and most momentous event.
